sources to predict, estimate, observe, measure, and record investigations.



Enrolment 2017: Enrolment for Junior Infants 2017 will be open from January 9th to January 31st. The enrolment policy can be found on our school website.




A Parent talk on 'The Transition from Primary School to Secondary School' took place on Wednesday Nov 9th in the school hall.
