


Please ensure all items of clothing and books are labelled with your child's name. It can be difficult to trace items once lost or mislaid. Parent/Teacher Meetings

5th class trip to The Casino at Marino

"On Wednesday the 28th of September, the two 5th classes visited the Casino in Marino.

if necessary to prevent head lice infestations.

It is an example of a neoclassical architecture. It was designed by the architect William Chambers in 1757 for Lord Charlemont. It took 12 years to build.

It's not a casino where you go to gamble it means 'little house' in Italian. It might look small on the outside but it's actually huge inside. We learned from our guide that if you had a pineapple at that time you were considered very wealthy, you could also rent a pineapple for £7000. In one of the rooms there is a poison called arsenic in the walls so we weren't allowed to touch them.

We also saw the underground tunnels which Lord Charlemont used for his servants so they would not block his
